³⁾ The "accommodation" item is generally negligible for students living with their parent(s). Source: Swiss Federal Statistical Office (2010), *Studieren unter Bologna*.

⁴⁾ Including meals taken in the university cafeteria.

⁵⁾ Includes the average health insurance premium for students under the age of 25, minus the premium subsidy. Health insurance premiums vary significantly from canton to canton. Also includes deductibles not covered by the health insurance fund. Premiums are much higher for people over the age of 25!

⁶⁾ Includes the cost of the TNW transport network subscription (eco season ticket), CHF 53 up to the age of 25, then CHF 80, plus other transport costs.

⁷⁾ Smokers please note: You will need to budget up to around CHF 200 per month!

⁸⁾ Telephone/internet, OASI minimum contribution, household/liability insurance, etc.
