With the campaign that launches today, movetia, the National Agency for Exchange and Mobility, wants to make exchanges and mobility something self-understood.

In 2022/2023, the International Office already initiated activities to motivate various target groups at the university to participate in exchange semesters, staff weeks, or intercultural courses. Through flyers for students titled "Discover New Comfort Zones," we highlighted our various offerings at bachelor's and master's day events, at the start of lectures, and through information and training events in collaboration with departments.

The new campaign targets all levels of education and supports projects for individuals and for groups, both in Switzerland and abroad. It encourages students to take action, step out

of their comfort zone, discover new horizons, and shape social change in the best possible way. The value of such an experience for students is immense. Not only do they learn or deepen their knowledge of a new language, they also acquire important professional and personal skills. These skills facilitate their entry into the job market. Moreover, exchange and mobility benefit both the Swiss education system and the economy, as they both profit from fresh perspectives and ideas.

Visit by the Swedish Foundation for Strategic Research

Financed by the Swedish Foundation for Strategic Research (Strategiska), a high-ranking delegation from Sweden visited the University of Basel on 24 September in the framework of a highly competitive leadership program. The International Office together with the Grants Office (both part of the Vice President's Office for Research) invited the group to the Kollegienhaus on the Petersplatz for an exchange. After introductions and overviews concerning the university, its international outreach, and the funding of grantees within the European Research Council scheme (ERC), Prof. Philipp Treutlein, the deputy head of the Department of Physics and an ERC-grantee himself, provided an overview of his department's work and its funding structure. By sharing insights on career development and selection processes for open positions at his department, he engaged members of the group in a lively debate. All the participants work at public research institutions and went through a rigorous selection process before joining this leadership program, which is chaired by the former vice chancellor of the Royal Institute of Technology KTH, Prof. Dr. Peter Gudmundson.

In the afternoon, the group was received by the Biozentrum, its director, Prof. Dr. Alexander Schier, and high-ranking researchers.

Yukiko Tomooka, PhD student in biomedical engineering

Yukiko Tomooka, a PhD student and Swiss Government Excellence Scholarship holder, started her doctoral studies at the University of Basel in the fall of 2021 at the Bio-Inspired RObots for MEDicine-Laboratory (BIROMED-Lab) in the Department of Biomedical Engineering at the University of Basel under the supervision of Prof. Dr. Georg Rauter.

Yukiko's PhD research has focused on developing miniature robots for minimally invasive medical applications. She is currently working on designing an intraoral robot to allow automated high-accuracy tooth treatment; her research is also part of an Innosuisse project.

Yukiko has now won a very competitive early career grant from the Leading House Asia (located at the ETH Zurich) to finance a research stay at Hokkaido University in Japan, where she did her bachelor's and master's studies. She will conduct a mechanical design analysis of the robot developed at the BIROMED-Lab to investigate the robot's structural robustness and identify desired design parameters for developing the next prototype.
